The current population of forcibly displaced people is **79.5 million**. This number has almost **doubled** in the last decade.

Why has it risen?

Conflicts are continuing for longer and refugees are not able to return in the same numbers as previous decades.

Displaced people returning home:

1990-2000

Around **15 million**

2000-2010

Around **10 million**

2010-2020

Only **3.9 million**

This means that we need to provide more shelter solutions for displaced populations than ever before. We also need to innovate better shelters, to keep those communities safe and comfortable, regardless of location.

How do we engineer new and improved shelters for these growing populations?

We work with humanitarian organisations and other suppliers to unite as an industry and determine the most important needs. Then we produce tougher, smarter, high performing shelters to ensure a fit-for-purpose solution for those in need.



There are **30-34 million** forcibly displaced children

That means our family tents and our multipurpose tents have to be designed to provide them the best environment to grow.

How have we updated?



Fire resistant tent material



Stronger structures to withstand strong winds



Better ventilation to keep shelters cool



Insulation to keep shelters warm in cold climates



Solar Lighting solutions



Medical Tents with Special Cabins for Treatment
