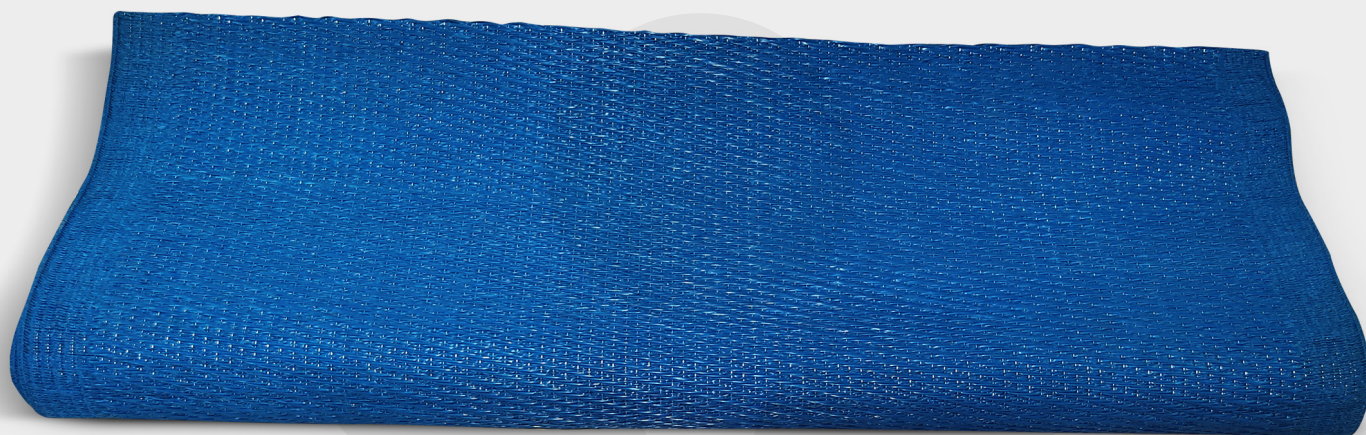

- » Suits 1 adult or 2 children.

Colour	Blue or white
General Quality	Homogeneous weaving (no non-weaved tubes) Synthetic sleeping mats are used to sleep on and are waterproof, tear proof and material trim finished
